The Parish Clerk was working on the new regulations to ensure the Council became compliant. The appointment of a Data Protection Officer would be considered in due course.

FORMATION OF A NEW 'FOOTPATHS GROUP'

A Footpaths Group had been set up to look at whether the existing footpath network could be improved through the addition of paths that had been lost over time but which might still be eligible for adding to the Definitive Map. The terms of reference of this Group would be tabled at a future meeting of the Group. Hugh Brookes is to chair the Footpaths Group.

VILLAGE MAP

Mrs Ruth Gerring had produced a 'Village Map' in water colour, showing various places of interest around the village and consideration was being given to it being mounted and displayed in a suitable public location.

ROAD SAFETY

Funding for the measures put forward by the Road Safety Group and following the public consultation, including the public meeting on the 24th March, was being pursued. It was hoped the Road Safety Group would continue to report regularly to the Parish Council on this matter.
