- d) Village Hall Registration

Mr V. Hodgkins read a letter from Miss Smith of the Charity Commission. requesting details of cash on deposit, reference Para.7 of the Draft document. Mr Ackland has agreed to supply this information.

e) Old Toilets at rear of premises in New Road

Mr E. Clarke said he had mentioned the question of repair to Mr Holloway of the small Holdings Committee and there was no money available.

Mr V. Hodgkins said this answer was not acceptable.

Mr T. Cox suggested a letter should be sent to the Conservation Officer (Mr Audley-Miller) and also contact Col. Walton.

It was agreed to do this.

Following this Mr E. Clarke said that Item I on the Agenda should now be proceeded with.

I. To allow fifteen minutes for residents to ask questions

Mrs Marion Gardiner asked whether any application for funds towards street naming had been made to the Vale of White Horse. No application had yet been made.

Mrs Venn asked whether the pile of branches at the entrance to the playing field could be disposed of.

Mr J. Ody and Mr E. Clarke agreed to do this.

It was agreed to enter the Best Mept Village Competition and Mr J. Ody said that the Youth Club would clean the ditches out.

Mr David Douglas asked if there could be a clean up before the Ist May.
Mr E. Clarke replied that nowwe have a Village Street Cleaner it was just necessary for everyone to ensure their own frontages were tidy.

5. To consider any Planning Matters

a) Goosey Wick Farm - Removing of Old Granary.

Mr V. Hodgkins suggested that this should be viewed by the Farish Council and recommend to the Vale of White Horse that the Museum Department be consulted in case it could be transported to Cogges. This was agreed.

b) The Clerk reported that two applications (32 & 20 New Road) had been received that day and it was agreed to make observations on these at a Special Meeting.

6. To arrange date for Annual Parish Assembly

This was agreed to be held on 27th April, at 8.00p.m.

7. To discuss Street Names

Mr V. Hodgkins said that the important matter at this stage was not the position of signs but names to be adopted.

District Councillor T. Cox said the Vale of White Horse will position signs after consultation with Parish Council.

After some discussion it was agreed that the following names would be proposed to the Annual Assembly meeting:- New Road, Buckland Road, (Mr V. Hodgkins would have preferred Faringdon Road) Bridle Fath, Longworth Road, Main Street or High Street and Butts Lane - this was proposed by Mr V. Hodgkins instead of New or Chapel Iane and all agreed.

Mrs T. Cox said Mr Ackland had suggested that New Road should become School Road.

8. To discuss Emergency Planning

Mr Eld sent his apologies for being unable to attend the meeting. He had informed the Committee that the proposed questionnaire had been commended by Major Lucas.

Mr V. Hodgkins suggested that Mr Eld attend the meeting that would be held to discuss two planning applications.

9. Any other Business

a) Village Hall (New)

Mr G. Rumble in reply to question by Mr V. Hodgkins said that more information on other Village Hall projects was being sent and that he hoped to have a report before next meeting.

Mr V. Hodgkins suggested that a special meeting of the Parish Council and the Village Hall [committee be held before the next meeting. This was agreed.

b) Street Names

Mrs T. Cox renquired how soon could money be allocated by the Vale of the White Horse for street names. District Councillor T. Cox suggested the Parish Council write to Environmental Services. Possible proposals by mid-May.

c) Bridle Path past Playing Field

Mr J. Ody said part of this appeared to have been ploughed up. Mr E. Clarke would investigate.

d) Playing Field Lease

Mr J. Ody asked if any progress had been made on this matter. The Clerk said he had not received anything for several months but the Draft Lease was being prepared. He would contact the Valuation Officer to ascertain latest position. The meeting closed at 9.25p.m.

- a) Mr Gibbons, 32 New Road, single storey extension

Prior to the meeting, the Vale of White Horse planning officer had agreed to consider a revised plan showing a pitched roof instead of flat. The Farish Council all approved this amendment and agreed to recommend acceptance by Vale of White Horse.

b) Mr Francis, 20 New Road - to enlarge above existing extension to roof height.

Mt V. Hodgkins thought this proposal would enhance the property and the rest of the Parish Council concurred and agreed to recommend acceptance by the Vale of the White Horse.

2. Emergency Planning

Mr Eld said that Major Lucas had made one comment upon the questionnaire.

This concerned the question regarding household resources. Mr J. Ody and Mr E. Clarke thought this should be deleted completely.

Mr J. Ody said he would prefer the question to be "Would you allow any foof in hand at time of emergency to be made available to Community".

Mr G. Rumble said that the size of the questionnaire caused concern.

Mr Eld suggested ommitting "average stock of fuel and food."

Mr Eld said he would redraft and resubmit the questionnaire.

Mr V. Hodgkins suggested a covering letter be sent out with questionnaire.

Mr Eld said this would be better if signed by the Parish Council Chairman.,

and he agreed to submit details at the Annual Assembly.

Mr Eld said he had also been asked to suggest suitable premises for Headquarters and thought the Manor may be ideal.

Mr E. Clarke said this might be subject to flooding.

Mr V. Hodgkins suggested the 'Barn on the Green,' 'The Chequers' or 'Cottage on the Green,'

Mr Eld said he would consult further on this matter.

3. Any other business

Mr G. Rumble said that someone had reported a youth riding a motorbike along Chapel Iane.

Mr E. Clarke said he had enquired from the Police re riding on footpaths and that this was an arrestible offence.

Mr V. Hodgkins asked whether a Police Constable could attend the Youth Club and stress this point.

Mr J. Ody agreed to this and would ask the local constable.
