

Charney's Smallest Feathered Resident

The Goldcrest is the smallest bird in the UK, just 9cm in length, and weighs approximately 5.5g, which is the equivalent of a twenty pence coin.

Goldcrests are resident in the UK all year round; winter is the key time of year for spotting Goldcrests in the garden. They eat insects - spiders, caterpillars, flies and moth eggs etc. Their beaks are thin and pointed to pick out insects from among dense pine needles.

VWHDC Fly-Tipping Prosecution

Vale of White Horse District Council has successfully prosecuted a plasterer from Faringdon whose building waste was dumped across a rural road after he paid two strangers to get rid of it.

He had paid the men £25 to dispose of the waste but has ended up being ordered to pay more than £1,600 by a court because it was then fly-tipped.



FROM THE VILLAGE RECORDS

20 YEARS AGO: 'The 'Charney Bassett' and 'Caution Children' signs at the approach to the village had been stolen and were believed to be in Scotland. The [Parish] Clerk was asked if he could assist with their recovery.'

A few weeks ago in 2019: late night vandalism saw the Charney Bassett sign at the Buckland Road entrance point to the village go missing. This time it was much easier to track the missing sign which was found in the hedge. It is hoped the sign will be replaced in the near future.

20 YEARS AGO: 'Mr Clarke (Cllr) suggested that the opportunity for Parish Councils to undertake minor road works published in a memo from OCC should be taken and a footpath from the Buckland Road junction with New Road to the (old) playing field should be constructed. He had obtained an estimate... The [Parish] Clerk cautioned against hasty acceptance of this proposal and it was agreed to look at the matter carefully again.' (Extract from Parish Council Minutes)

A few weeks ago in 2019: The path has been completed and is well used. It has taken a long time! So well done Charney Army!


