History Group News

The Charney Bassett History Group has joined the **Oxfordshire Local History Association (OLHA)** and has been welcomed in their <u>latest e-bulletin</u>. The OLHA fosters and promotes the study and publication of local history and acts as an umbrella organisation for local history groups, of which there are more than 80 in Oxfordshire.

We now:

- receive an <u>e-bulletin</u> every month, full of up-to-date information on what's happening in local history across Oxfordshire, plus a diary of talks and meetings;
- receive the journal once a year, containing articles by Oxfordshire local historians on a wide range of topics;
- have the opportunity to publish research in that journal;
- can attend two OLHA study days a year, each on a specific topic and with several speakers and a guided tour; and
- are kept in touch with other Oxfordshire local historians.

In the previous journal there was an extensive article on the recusant Catholics in this area focussing particularly on the Yate family in Bampton and Lyford. The Yate family came to the Vale as wool merchants. In the mid-1400s, <u>Richard Yate</u> settled in Charney Bassett. His son John traded from Charney as a highly reputed merchant of the staple at Calais. John Yate owned sheep farms in Wantage and Lambourn; in 1538 he bought the former Abingdon Abbey grange at nearby Lyford and moved there.

Lyford Grange at the time was a moated manor house similar in scale to Baddesley Clinton. It was there that Edward Campion was captured after a protracted search and he was eventually hanged, drawn and quartered. In 1970 he was formally declared a saint by the Pope.

Earlier this year we were contacted by a descendant of the Yate family in America and were able to send them information for their family history.

Earlier this year the Management Committee announced measures to

- explore what, if any, changes are needed to bring our constitution up to date

What We Have Done So Far

- Two Trustees are currently reviewing the constitution and taking advice from Community First
 Oxfordshire.
- Lead Trustees have been appointed for the Village Hall, the Field, Fundraising/Events Management, Finance and Management and Administration.
- Introduced a more flexible approach to the allocation of secretarial duties.
- Introduced the idea of shadow appointments so volunteers can find out more about what is involved.

Looking to 2020 and Beyond


CHAFT is planning for the possibility that some officials and committee members are likely to stand down and not offer themselves for re-election in 2020.


