County Councillor's Report

The report included comment on the Council's stance on the proposed Oxford-Cambridge Expressway and confirmation that Cllr Fitzgerald-O'Connor would follow up on concerns expressed at the last meeting about the Parish Council's involvement in discussion on the A420.

Updates regarding current status were given on:

- the Charney field aspens;
- the white entrance gates to the Village;
- the new causeway footpath;
- public benches.

Other items on the agenda included: planning matters, the District Councillor's report and the Clerk's financial report.

General Election 2019



On Thursday 12 December 2019 you can vote to elect an MP to represent your local area in parliament.

Here is some useful information about the election:

Voter registration

In order to vote on 12 December, you need to be registered by 26 November. If you're not registered at your current address visit **gov.uk/register-to-vote** to ensure you are eligible to vote.

If you have moved house since you last registered you will need to register again.

Polling cards

If you registered to vote by 4 November, you should receive your poll card by 20 November – if you don't receive it by this date please call the Elections team on 01235 422528 to make sure you are still registered.

If you registered after 4 November you should receive your poll card by 3 December.

Postal and proxy voting

Postal vote applications need to reach the Elections team by 5pm on 26 November – application forms are available at whitehorsedc.gov.uk/votebypost.

If you apply for a postal vote you should receive your ballot pack by 6 December – if it doesn't arrive by this date please contact the Elections team on 01235 422528 to request a replacement.

Important – due to the short timescales involved, there is no guarantee when people will receive their postal ballot pack, therefore if you are likely to be away after 6 December you should consider applying for a proxy vote instead to guarantee you can vote. The deadline to apply for a proxy vote is 5pm on 4 December. To find out more please visit whitehorsedc.gov.uk/votebyproxy.


An Evening with the History Group



Garden waste will not be collected over Christmas. However, extra recycling, which will not fit in the green bin, can be put out in clear bags or cardboard boxes beside the bin. Also extra food recycling that won't fit in your food bin will be collected if put in a bag on top of the food bin.

Free parking in the run up to Christmas

Drivers in South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse can benefit from free parking in district council car parks on certain days in December.

The annual free parking tradition is provided by South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse district councils to encourage people to shop locally and socialise in the local pubs, cafés and restaurants during the festive period.

Drivers will be able to park without paying for a ticket in Vale and South car parks on the following days next month:

Vale of White Horse

- Abingdon Saturdays (7, 14, 21 December)
- Faringdon Saturdays (7, 14, 21 December)
- Wantage Saturdays (7, 14, 21 December)

South Oxfordshire

- Didcot Mondays (9, 16, 23 December)
- Goring Saturdays (7, 14, 21 December)
- Henley Tuesdays (3, 10, 17 December)
- Thame Saturdays (7, 14, 21 December)
- Wallingford -Thursdays (5, 12,19 December)

On the above days there is no need to display a ticket.

Parking is also free on a Sunday in many of the councilowned town centre car parks in South and Vale - please check the tariff boards in car parks for further details.
