Secondly, the sketch is one of the oldest illustrations of a group of mummers, and possibly the oldest drawing made at the time of performance.



Expert advice is being taken to deal with the serious problem of rabbits on the playing field and neighbouring land.

It is hoped CHAFT will be in a position to go public on an action plan to deal with the Aspens early in the New Year.

# Longworth Area Trust Can the Trust help you or someone in need that you know?

In the distant past, a number of villagers of Longworth and Charney Basset left money in their wills to be used to help people in those parishes. This money started the Longworth Area Trust.

- a) Grants can be made where people find themselves in difficulty through illness, disability or unexpected expenses of various kinds and neither the local authority nor central government can provide adequate assistance.
- b) Only people living within the civil parish boundaries of Longworth, Charney Bassett and the old parish of Draycott Moor (now mainly Southmoor) are eligible to benefit.

Within those limits, and so far as funds allow, the Trustees are able to make small grants to help in difficult circumstances. **All applications and payments are strictly confidential.**
