## **Snippets from the March meeting of the Parish Council**

#### Road safety

County Council to be asked to install 30mph repeater signs on Lyford Road subject to comment from the Church and the Manor.

The village has a volunteer to act as its pothole 'super user'.

Representations have been made with the County Council re verges on Longworth Road, North of Hunters Moon and the state of the road connecting Fyfield Wick to the Longworth Road.

The village was represented at a meeting on safety of A420 attended by local MP David Johnstone.

#### Recycling

Stanford in the Vale Recycling Centre will be closed on 21st/22nd April.

### Villages benches

VWHDC has approved a grant of 50% towards replacement of Village benches, but this project will have to be put back due to the Covid19 outbreak.

#### Code of conduct

New code of conduct for Councillors adopted.

Improvements have been made to the website by the Communications Group, in accordance with new accessibility requirements.

Parish Council will agree an accessibility statement later this year.

## Covid-19 Scams

Sadly there are scams emerging from our current situation, those below, many more and one which looks convincing on an email saying that your TV Licence needs renewing and asking you to click a link. Please think very carefully before answering the door to anyone you don't know, taking action or giving information over the phone to anyone you can't confirm as being authentic, or clicking any link on an email unless you are sure. Ask for help or an opinion, ring a neighbour or one of the Parish Councillors. A scam is the last thing you need right at this time

A message from the Chartered Institute of Trading Standards

• Warning about an email scam claiming to be from the Government purporting to offer a tax rebate to support people through the Coronavirus outbreak. The emails, which look official, inform the recipient of the rebate amount and request that they click a link to receive it. At the link, the recipient is asked to fill in personal details, including their credit card number and address. These details allow the scammer to take money directly from the recipient's bank account.

- Asking the public to be wary of a new emerging scam involving several 'coronavirus update' fake phone apps, which claim to provide updates on the virus. - Warning the public not to open their doors to bogus healthcare workers claiming to be offering 'home-testing' for the COVID-19 coronavirus. Suspicious callers are said to have been knocking on doors of elderly and vulnerable residents in various parts of the UK, saying that they are health officials doing door-to-door testing.

# ALL PUBLIC WORSHIP IS NOW ON HOLD UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

As many of you will now know, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, in line with government advice, have issued guidance that all public worship be put on hold for the time being. This means that there will be no Sunday or weekday church services, including public Morning Prayer, until further notice.

However, the Church of England continues to be a strong presence of prayer and action in our communities. Our ministry team continues to say morning prayer daily at home, and now meets weekly for a private Eucharist on behalf of and to pray for the whole benefice. We are also available for pastoral support, though this may be more by phone and email than in person as the need for social distancing and self-isolation grows, especially among the more vulnerable. The churches in Buckland, Charney Bassett, Longworth, Littleworth and Lyford are also open every day for private prayer. Please do feel free to go in and take some time to be still and reflect and pray, whenever you wish or need to do so.

As we are no longer doing public church services, we will instead share messages of hope and faith through the Thursday emails and on our website blog, so please stay in touch. It would presently seem that our website and emails are the best way of staying in touch with the majority of people, as they are regularly updated.



# TEMPORARILY PROHIBITS THE USE OF AND WAITING ON THE HIGHWAY BY ALL MOTOR VEHICLES

REASON: To facilitate carriageway crack / join sealing work

DURATION: Starting on 30 March 2020

This will operate between 09:00am and 05:00pm (09:00 and 17:00) hours(Traffic Regulation

Notices cover a maximum of 5 consecutive days.)

ACCESS: Limited access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for frontages within the closed section of road, subject to the progress of the works

The "No Waiting" restriction means that wherever there are in place yellow "No Waiting" cones, you will not be able to park vehicles on the highway.

SUGGESTED ALTERNATIVE ROUTE: via Northmead Lane, Hyde Road, Main Street, Winter Lane, Unnamed Road and vice versa

#### AND

LOCATION: Wantage, Buckland Road ALSO Wantage, New Road, Charney Bassett

REASON: To facilitate carriageway resurfacing works

DURATION: Starting on 14 April 2020

The anticipated completion date is 19 April 2020 (date included). This will operate between

04:00am and 06:00 (04:00 and 18:00) hours.

(Traffic Regulation Notices cover a maximum of 5 consecutive days.)

ACCESS: Limited access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for frontages within the closed section of road, subject to the progress of the works

The "No Waiting" restriction means that wherever there are in place yellow "No Waiting" cones, you will not be able to park vehicles on the highway.

SUGGESTED ALTERNATIVE ROUTE: via Longworth Road, Charney Road, A420, B4508 and vice **versa**
