

### Closure Order

Following several successful drug warrants in Faringdon the Neighbourhood Team were successful in obtaining a Closure Order at Westbrook with the aim of reducing drug related activity and anti-social behaviour caused. The previous Closure Order at The Lees proved very successful so expect to see us paying lots of attention to this area to reinforce the message. ### Rogue Traders operation

The Team spent the day with the Trading Standards Rogue Trader Unit as part of a national campaign to safeguard the vulnerable in our communities from fraudsters. During our patrols we would stop and chat to tradesman and handymen as well as the home owner to ensure all was well. Despite not catching any fraudsters out we did manage to advise many people on how to protect themselves from being a victim of fraud. We advise that if you are looking for a Tradesman then ask a friend or family member to recommend someone. Say 'NO' to cold callers at the doorstep or on the telephone.

### Leave a light on and burglars in the dark!

Now that the days are getting shorter please follow some simple guidelines to help prevent becoming a victim of burglary:

- Invest in a light timer switch
- Close and lock all your doors and windows when going out or to bed
- Keep valuables out of sight
- Don't advertise you are away from home on social media

#### ***If you are trick-or-treating this year:***

- Don't knock where you see a 'No Trick-or-Treat' poster.
- Be visible and stick to well-lit streets.
- Although Halloween is meant to be spooky, be careful not to frighten people.
- Plan your trick-or-treat route before you go and let an adult know where you'll be going and what time you will be back.
- Go with an adult when possible.

#### ***If at any point you do feel nervous or unsafe:***

- Don't open your door if you're unsure who is there. Use your spy-hole, look out of a window, and use your door chain if you do decide to open your door.
- Have a contact number of a close relative or good neighbour by your telephone, just in case you need to phone them.
- If you are part of a Neighbourhood Watch scheme, let your coordinator know that you will be on your own at Halloween. If you are a coordinator, please identify people in your scheme that may be vulnerable and offer them reassurance.
- To report anti-social behaviour please call the 24 hour non-emergency number 101. If it is a crime in progress, call 999 immediately.

### Hate crime

A hate crime is any crime committed against a person which is perceived to be motivated by hostility or prejudice towards their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or transgender identity. Hate crimes can take place anywhere, even online. They can include threats, intimidation, damage to property and physical attacks. Last year at least six hate crimes were recorded every day in Thames Valley. No one should be targeted because of who they are, how they look or what they believe in.

If you or someone you know has been a victim of hate crime, or if you have witnessed a hate crime, report it on 101 or 999 in an emergency. Or you can contact Victims First on 0300 1234 148 for confidential advice and support.
