

Burglary

We have received reports of burglaries in the Shrivenham and Watchfield area. Crime prevention leaflets have been delivered to neighbouring properties and extra patrols will be carried out by the team. We are appealing for witnesses for three burglaries in this area:

Between Sunday 22nd of September and Wednesday 25th September unknown offenders broke into a property on Colton Road. Medals, cufflinks, rings and jewellery were stolen. A blue Volvo S60 was also stolen from the driveway. The three miniature medals are all on the same pin. One is a GSM with a Northern Ireland band. The ribbon is a purple centre and green either side. The middle medal was a jubilee medal, gold in colour, slightly smaller than the other two and on a white centre and blue either side ribbon, the 3rd medal is a long service and good conduct with bar, ribbon is maroon with white stripes on the edge. The wedding rings are engraved with initials and a wedding date of 31/12/1976. Occurrence reference: 43190298880.

Between Saturday 21st September and Saturday 28th September unknown offenders broke into a property on Cleycourt Road by smashing a rear dining room window. A messy search was carried out and jewellery was stolen. Occurrence reference: 43190300542.

Between 1.30pm on 24th September – 9am on 25th September. Unknown offenders gained access to a property in Squires Road, Watchfield by smashing rear French doors with tools. Once inside offenders stole items including jewellery and two Gucci watches. They also took the keys and stole a Ford Ranger which was parked outside. Occurrence reference: 43190296580.

Rural crime

Extra patrols are also being carried out to tackle the recent spike in rural crime surrounding the Ridgeway which resulted in a 4x4 being seized due to road traffic offences being committed. Officers issued a section 59 anti-social behaviour warning to the driver of a 4x4 who had been witnessed driving on the Ridgeway. The section 59 warning is issued against the driver and the vehicle meaning that if either are caught driving anti-socially again the vehicle can be seized. A vehicle and lurchers were seized from poachers following good work by the rural community at Pusey.
