Village Fete planned for September has been cancelled.

Village Hall will reopen 1st September. Risk assessments have been carried out and the Conditions of Hire are being updated to take account of COVID-19.

Face Masks

Remember that in England you must wear a face covering on public transport and from 24thJuly it is mandatory to wear one in shops and supermarkets.

So just a reminder that Julie Ingram-Johnson is still busy using her sewing talents to produce face masks for charity. To date, Julie has used over 70 metres of elastic – more than the length of two fully-grown blue whales.

The masks are available to view on a table in the carport of Gunton Barn (last house on the right at the top of the Village Green, opposite the pub). New designs are being added regularly.

The masks have been made with washed, new fabrics. There are three layers - fabric designed outer layer, flannel middle layer and a close weave reverse. The masks will fit adults but Julie will make children's masks if asked.



Church Online and Re-Opening the Church Buildings

During this time of lockdown, our benefice church services have moved online, and many people have been engaging with our Sunday worship and our weekday Morning Prayer. It has been so very encouraging and wonderful to see this, and realise once again, in a very visceral way, that Church is the people and not just our buildings!

That said, our church buildings are precious and sacred places of encounter and there has been a lot of discussion within the Ministry and Church Wardens Team about how best to re-open our church buildings for Sunday services and public worship now that the government has permitted this to happen.



We are delighted to announce that we will be able to return to public worship in St Mary's church in Buckland on Sunday 19th July at 10am. We will also continue livestreaming our Sunday service, as we know that many people do not yet feel safe going into public gatherings (or that 10am Sunday is just not possible for them), so if you prefer to join us from your home, you can still do so. More information will come out via our mailing list, on our website and via FaceBook (see below).

Due to the needs for cleaning and the limitations we have with our volunteers, many of whom are vulnerable or shielding, it will be a gradual process for our other church buildings to re-open for Sunday services, so bear with us - the Ministry and Church Wardens Team are working out how best to do this.

Please be assured that we will continue to provide an online service as a permanent part of our Benefice worship, so if for any reason you feel you can't come to church in person, you can always join us in worship via our YouTube channel (just search Benefice Cherbury Gainfield to find us) and we'll continue to send the direct link for this out each week by email to our subscribers. On the very rare occasion that all our tech helpers are on holiday, we will point people to the Diocese of Oxford "Church At Home" online service.

Our church buildings continue to be open for private prayer one day a week – so that there is a church open each day. Please see our website for more info – this is subject to change at relatively short notice as our churches are able to open more fully. Due to our volunteer limitations, at present we leave 72 hours between each use of the building to minimise or remove the need for full cleans between uses.

Charney Bassett Parish Council Summary of PC meeting of 8th July

The Parish Council met (by Skype) on 8th July. No residents were present and although virtual meetings look likely to continue for a while, Councillors will want to return to the Village Hall for meetings as soon as they feel it safe to do so.

Matters discussed included:

- Arrangements for a 3-day street cleaning programme by the District Council;
- Current balance of £11,700;
- Concerns about increasing lorry movements through the village due to development at Swanny Brook Farm, Fyfield Wick (NAP Grab Hire) and Long Meadow Barn, Denchworth (TLB Oxford);
- Current position on blocked drainage ditch on land west of Denchworth Road;
- Whether safe arrangements can be made to replace our various dilapidated public benches;
- Proposals by CHAFT to fell the aspen belt on Charney Field;
- Arrangements for Remembrance Day at the War Memorial;
- Thanks to Clive Dunn (New Road) for wonderful floral displays in recent years in the trough on the Village Green;
- A report by Christine Trotman on the Village College (including 2019-20 accounts).

The survey, launched on 16 July and running until midnight 13 August, doesn't focus on the here and now but is looking for feedback on the council's priorities over the next four years.

The responses gathered will help councillors finalise their mission statement, known as a Corporate Plan. The plan will enable them to focus the councils' work on what they and those living and working in the districts believe will make the district a better place for future generations.

Given this opportunity to adapt and change, we want to know what you think about our plans for the future, to make sure South Oxfordshire and the Vale of White Horse are the districts our communities want it to be.
