Charney Hall & Field Trust Village Hall Reopening

The management committee of CHAFT are pleased to announce that the Village Hall will reopen for booking from 1st September 2020. We have been working hard to make the hall safe for everyone following advice from the government, Community First Oxfordshire and ACRE (Action with Communities in Rural England). As a result of our risk assessment re Covid-19, we have put in place the following: four no touch hand sanitiser stations; three no touch hand wash dispensers; motion sensor lights in the toilets; lidded pedal bins in the toilets and kitchen; cleaning boxes in various locations with wipes and disposable gloves. We have also put in place a more robust cleaning regime. As a condition of hire, we will ask you to work with us and clean down frequently used surfaces with the wipes provided. Please read the various notices if you use the hall and do not enter the hall if you feel unwell. Remember to sanitise your hands on entering and on leaving.

Community First Oxfordshire's oil order scheme

We are rapidly approaching the Autumn and heating will become the normal within a few weeks, so perhaps it is time to review how and from whom you obtain your oil supplies.

Community First Oxfordshire (a charity operated for the benefit of rural dwellers) runs an oil supply scheme through AF Affinity which is a very large farming co-operative in Norfolk; each area has a Co-ordinator, see below, through which orders are placed approximately every two weeks with delivery within the following two weeks.

The pricing is usually well below the market prices that we as individuals can obtain. AF Affinity operate a Direct Debit scheme and your bank account is usually charged about 21 days after delivery. This saves charges for the use of a card and gives you a small credit free period!
