Parish Council Update

The Parish Council meeting of 13th January 2021 got off to a slow start due to connection problems on Skype. Full marks to the one resident in attendance for braving the initial turmoil. As a result of the late start one item had to be deferred to the next meeting (road safety funding) but those that were discussed included:

- Disappointing response from MoD on disturbance caused by helicopter training flights;
- Planned meeting with new trustees of Charney Manor;
- Impact of security lighting at Lyford Industrial Estate;
- Approved budget for 2021-22 with no increase of precept;
- Commencement of staged grant payments to CHAFT for recent tree felling on Charney Field;
- No objection to new agricultural worker's dwelling at Poplars Farm (Denchworth Road);
- Enforcement update on unauthorised development at Long Meadow Barn (Denchworth);
- Draft MoU with CHAFT to address arrangements for Hall and Charney Field;
- Donations to local charities;

History repeats itself

10 years ago: - The Clerk reported on a visit he made to RAF Benson with Ed Vaizey MP to learn of their training activities with respect to low flying over the village. The visit was made in response to a small number of complaints from villagers about low flying. The station commander was at pains to explain the steps they take to minimise the impact on the habitations over which they fly but the primary aim of training is to provide aircrew with the experience needed to protect them when flying over enemy territory, where they need to keep at or below 100 feet to avoid rocket propelled grenades (RPGs).

The Woodland Project

The felling of the aspens is now complete and CHAFT is grateful to the Parish Council for releasing the first staged payment of their grant towards the cost of this part of the project.

Stump grinding has also been completed. The remaining stumps on the ditch bank which have not been ground out (on specialist advice) will be managed as part of a replanting and maintenance plan.

Advice was received that the chippings should not be spread across the cleared woodland area as this would stifle regrowth of the existing grass and plants. Volunteers have completed a first spread along the bridle pathway and willow arbour. When it is socially appropriate to reconvene, a second layer will be spread. A buyer has been found for any surplus chippings.

The felled timber stored on Buckland Road has been removed. Thanks go to the Cox family for their help and it is understood the agreed fee has been donated to charity.

CHAFT has set up a small project team charged with bringing forward and implementing proposals for the development and maintenance of the woodland area to satisfy the replanting requirements of the Felling Licence and secure the long term future of the area as a woodland. Terms of reference for the team have been agreed. The team will comprise Lucy Gildersleeves (lead trustee) Neil Dobson, Stephanie Wright and Ruth Clements with Anna Moffatt providing expert advice. Links with the Parish Council will be maintained.

The felling contractor will be providing native tree species and whips with a view to planting starting in autumn 2021.

A priority for the project team will be to seek the wider views of the local community on the redevelopment of the woodland and in its ongoing future.

Children's Play Area

The play park will remain open during the current lockdown provided users stick to the rules! Please comply with the displayed notices.

An independent safety inspection of the play park equipment has been booked for February.

(Traffic Regulation Notices cover a maximum of 5 consecutive days)


ACCESS: Limited access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and


for frontages within the closed section of road, subject to the progress

The "No Waiting" restriction means that wherever there are in place yellow "No Waiting" cones, you will not be able to park vehicles on the highway.

SUGGESTED ALTERNATIVE ROUTE: The alternative routes for traffic are via a combination of Longworth Road – Unnamed Road towards Fyfield Wick – Unnamed Road towards West Hanney – Unnamed Road towards Lyford – Unnamed Road towards Denchworth – Hyde Road – Northmead Lane – Land Brook and vice-versa.
