### **Charney Naturally**

No mow May has been and gone but this photograph from one of our residents who has left a patch of lawn uncut shows how a bit of 'neglect' can reap its own reward in the form of this wonderful clover field. Great to look at but also a feast for bees and other pollen-loving insects.



Unlikely you'll end up with one of these beauties in your lawn but the Pyramid, Marsh, and Bee Orchids have been photographed around and about in Charney by keen-eyed locals. Should you be lucky enough to spot one, please remember to treat them with respect.

Last year we were fortunate to have a Pyramid Orchid in the churchyard at St Peter's. This area is left unmown except for paths and is now becoming a wildflower meadow and amazing natural habitat. Why not explore and enjoy nature and local history living in harmony.

In addition, there is Agrimony, with its slender tapering spikes of primrose yellow, star shaped flowers and finely cut leaves, which seems to be a bit more common on roadside verges around Charney this year. Apparently it seeds relatively late so fewer and later cuts of roadside verges may have helped. Other names for it include Aaron's rod, Church-Steeples, Clot-Bur, Fairy's wand, Money-in-both-pockets, Salt-and-pepper and Sweethearts (from the clinging receptacles of the fruit).











We take no prisoners, and this will make a lovely new gazeebo for the Charney fete.

### News from CHAFT

#### **Policy Development**

It has been a busy time since the last issue of the Chatter went to press, so read on for a brief update.

#### Management Committee (June)

Issues covered included:

- Ownership of the hall and field, following advice from Community First and ACRE (Action with Rural Communities in England);
- Future policy development for the whole parcel of land known as Charney Field;
- Replanting of the woodland area;
- Proposed joint 'Have Your Say' event with the Parish Council;

· Safeguarding training.

Policy Development

#### Annual General meeting (July)

The AGM was held virtually on 7<sup>th</sup> July 2021 and finished in record time (nothing to do with the important football match being played later that evening!)

The Annual Report of the Trustees was approved.

In commenting on the report, retiring Interim Chair David Sibbert referred to a number of important initiatives and developments:

- Policy statements have been updated to meet legal and insurance requirements;
- Potentially dangerous trees in the woodland area of the field have been felled after a lengthy planning process;
- Longer term outline planning processes (5 years and beyond) are now in place. A feasibility study of
  potential Hall improvements is underway and financial planning for the eventual replacement of
  expensive play equipment is in hand;
- Clarification of the ownership of the Field and Hall has been sought (in liaison with the Parish Council), and the individual and collective responsibilities of the Trustees more clearly defined.

In conclusion he stressed the importance of succession planning and the need to ensure the charity has the necessary capacity and skills to cope with increased responsibilities.

Challenges ahead

A review of the constitution as set out in the governing document would be necessary.

Last but not least, he thanked the Trustees, Officers and all volunteers for their support in ensuring the Hall and Field continue to provide excellent facilities for the local community.

A meeting of the newly elected Management Committee followed. The main business item was the election of the Trustees and Officers.

- Contingency decision-making arrangements in the event of disruption to scheduled meeting timetable (Covid-19).



vehicles and for frontages within the closed section of road,



Application has been made to the Vale Council by 'Bass Therapy Presents J Fest' for a licence to play live and amplified music at an outdoor event at Poplars Farm, Denchworth Road from 12.00 pm on Bank Holiday Sunday (29<sup>th</sup> August) until 1.00 am at night. Application is also made for a licence to sell and supply alcohol, attendees to be ticket only and limited to 1,000.
