Parish Council

The Parish Council met on 8th September and was joined by 5 members of the public and District Councillor Eric Batts. The issues discussed included:

The live music event at Poplars Farm on Bank Holiday Sunday;

- On-going suspension of the Garden Waste collection service;
- Land put forward for development in Charney in the Vale Local Plan;
- Transfer of the Bank Account from HSBC to Unity;
- Opposition to the level of development in the draft Oxfordshire Plan 2050 and the Ox-Camb Arc;
- Attendance at a legal briefing being organised by CHAFT on its future governance arrangements;
- Background to ownership of the Village Hall and Charney Field;
- Future developments at Charney Manor (including closure of the allotments);
- · Arrangements for Remembrance Sunday at the War Memorial;
- Involvement in the Ramblers' Association 'Don't Lose Your Way' initiative.

Charney Manor

The Society of Friends has recently advised the Parish Council of possible future developments at the Manor.

The most immediate involves the village allotments. These occupy the former kitchen garden and the chef at the Manor wishes to cultivate vegetables and fruit for his kitchen (and possibly for sale in a newly formed shop). Allotment holders have already been given notice to quit. The Parish Council is considering if another area can be found.

How might the recently granted Premises Licence be used? Trustees still appear to be considering this, and of course there may yet be changes to the scope of the licence as there is an on-going appeal against the decision - to be heard by Magistrates on 3rd December.

Other initiatives being considered by trustees include:

- Submission of a planning application for the continued siting of a marquee;
- Glamping pods in the north-east of the site (subject to planning permission);
- Employment of a part-time professional gardener;
- · Further tree planting in the grounds;
- Opening meal services to non-residents.

Village College

The future of the Village College is still under discussion, having been deferred at the last meeting of the Parish Council.

The College was set up some 20 years ago with grant aid from the government and Abingdon and Witney Technical College. Courses were run in the Village Hall in collaboration with the College, in particular on the mysteries of the internet and computers. At that time the Village Hall enjoyed an internet connection and classes were well attended.

As people became more computer literate, the link with the Technical College petered out. But the Village College continued to re-invent itself and has organised many other classes including quilting, Pilates, yoga and bridge. These classes have been developed and run by Christine Trotman and a small committee (its Terms of Reference are here), but Christine feels the time is right for her to stand down.

If the Village College is to continue it needs a new lead. Is there anyone out there who would like to take the College further again, possibly with fresh ideas? CHAFT is currently exploring the provision of superfast broadband in the hall which would open up new opportunities.
