#### **Churchyard Sleep-out for Charity**

Aspire Oxford and YoCO are two local charities which support young people who are disadvantaged or homeless in Oxfordshire. The Covid pandemic has affected us all but one group which has been especially affected is young people who are leaving school and starting work.

The pandemic has disrupted the lives of families, children and young people across the country, interrupting their education and leaving many young people confused and vulnerable to the pressures of social media with the consequence that they feel isolated and forgotten.

Here in Oxfordshire the number of children in care has risen by 80% in the past ten years. Sadly by the time they are twenty-one, 39% of these will have failed to enter education, employment or job training.

I am a 75 year-old resident of Buckland and on Tuesday 14 December I will be 'rough sleeping' in Charney churchyard as part of a seven nights 'sleepout' around the benefice churches in order to draw attention to the problem.

Nelson Mandela stated that young people, 'are the rock on which our future will be built' so please help me ensure their future.
