

Findings and Conclusions of the Archaeological investigations of the last few years

This talk will be by David Ashby, our supervising archaeologist and advisor. The talk will cover the findings and conclusions from the various digs, geophysics surveys in Charney and most recently the 3D laser scans of Charney Manor and St Peter's Church. It will last about an hour plus a Q&A session.

The talk is open to all and is particularly aimed at updating all those who took part in the various activities and others interested in the history of Charney. It will be fascinating to hear the conclusions of the work so far.
