


Charney Chatter



Charney Bassett Parish Council

The Parish Council met in the Village Hall on 7th September. Items discussed included:

- Continued search for a replacement allotment site
- Amendments made to standing orders for meetings
- Complaints received about increased helicopter movements
- Charney flower troughs
- Update on Airband UK
- Cost of living support for Band E-H properties
- Planning application for the marquee at Charney Manor
- Road Safety Group recommendations
- Village Hall hire charge increase
- Parish Council Code of Conduct

20 MPH Speed Limit in Charney? Have your say!



As part of our application to be considered for a change to a 20mph speed limit in our Village we wish to gauge views of residents. In the next few weeks a questionnaire will be circulated asking for your views: 'support, neutral, against' plus any specific comments that you may have and it would be really helpful to hear from as many people as possible.

Road Safety was the top concern in the Village's community led plan and much has been achieved since then. Now, Oxfordshire County Council is supporting applications for 20mph speed limits and many communities have or are applying for this reduction including villages adjacent to us.

Safer roads: Research by the UK Transport Research Laboratory has shown that every 1mph reduction in average urban speeds can result in a 6 per cent fall in the number of casualties. It's also been shown that you are seven times more likely to survive if you are hit by a car driving at 20mph, than if you are hit at 30mph. If a child suddenly steps in front of a car, you are much less likely to seriously injure or kill them if you keep to a 20mph limit.

Airband UK Update

Airband wrote in July, inviting us all to an online meeting about ultra-fast broadband in Charney. We believe that barely anyone attended the meeting and the company has just advised that they will not be developing here (or putting up new overhead poles and wires). History and Archaeology Group Dig Date 15-16th October

We have two adjacent sites agreed for archaeological test pit (1m²) digs in our village. This gives us 4 pits to dig over the weekend of 15-16th Oct 2022 and to find exciting things and expand the knowledge of the history of Charney. Once again David Ashby has kindly agreed to supervise our efforts.

There are lots of activities to chose from, digging, trowelling, sifting and looking for finds, identifying objects, making records, drawing, photographing and of course chatting, catching up and learning more about our village. David is on hand to help, advise and explain.
