## **Environmental Policy**

CHAFT is committed to supporting the environment by

- · minimising the harmful effects of its operations on the environment
- protecting and enhancing biodiversity and wildlife
- promoting good environmental practice

## **CHAFT** aims

- · To apply environmentally and socially responsible purchasing
- To reduce consumption, re-use materials and recycle wherever possible
- To promote efficient use of all resources, including energy and water
- To be sensitive to the character and habitats of the local setting when developing and improving the hall and the field

CHAFT will, wherever possible

- 1. In applying an environmentally and socially responsible approach to purchasing
  - 1.1 Consider the need for buying in materials or services and the options for alternative provision
  - 1.2 Take into account the environmental impact of product lifecycle when choosing materials or services
  - 1.3 Use local products, craftsmen and companies wherever possible and appropriate
- 2. Reduce consumption, re-use and recycle materials
  - 2.1 Use water butt at the hall to capture rainwater for plants; use water sparingly on the field and limit evaporation
  - 2.2 Offer materials no longer needed to individuals or organisations who can re-use them
  - 2.3 Provide and use clearly-marked bin at the hall for collection of recyclables

- 3. Promote efficient use of all resources, including energy and water
  - 3.1 Use water-saving approaches
    - Fit water-saving devices (taps, save-a-flush cisterns)
    - Use residual hot water from kettles for washing-up at catering events
  - 3.2 Minimise electricity use
    - Make best use of natural light and heat from south-facing window
    - Use point-of-use hot water systems in kitchen and toilets
  - 3.3 Use energy-efficient appliances
  - 3.4 Improve energy-efficient heating and reduce heat loss
    - Aim to improve hall insulation and glazing
    - Aim to use time-programmed and/or thermostatic heating system controls
  - 3.5 Raise awareness of responsible purchasing and sustainable energy
    - Include CHAFT responsible purchasing statement with hall booking form / user agreement
    - Display the CHAFT environmental policy within the hall and post it on the website
- 4. Be sensitive to the character and habitats of the local setting when developing and improving the hall and field
  - 4.1 Take into account the rural aspect when planning developments on the field, maintaining sightlines
  - 4.2 Limit the use of artificial fertilisers or pesticides
  - 4.3 Encourage local wildlife and flora through sympathetic support of habitat and maintenance programmes
