A Wartime Memory

While out wandering around Charney recently, I was buzzed by a very low-flying Hercules which reminded me of a brief wartime experience.

It was a rather dismal Sunday afternoon at my prep-school in the Meon Valley in Hampshire. The war in Europe was still in full swing, so it must have been about 1942/43. My parents were visiting me as my father had managed to get a day off from his army unit. It was a small boarding school, only about 40 boys at the time, and the headmaster allowed us to use his study for the meeting. The school was situated in rather splendid parkland with plenty of trees including a rather grand cedar just outside the study window. As my parents and I sat talking, we noticed that there was a very noisy aircraft approaching and obviously very low. We rushed to the window just in time to see a German Dornier bomber flying literally at tree-top height (I can remember seeing the top of the cedar swaying in the wind). We could also see the tail gunner let off a few rounds but no one or anything sustained any damage. It was all over in a couple of seconds, and we settled down and carried on as normal.

On the news that evening, we heard that a German plane had crashed near Southampton.

Later that year when the school swimming pool, which was filled from the Meon stream, was receiving its annual clean, the staff found a pair of German binoculars in the mud at the bottom of the pool!

Comments from the History Group

The World Wars touched communities across the UK, including Charney. Our own local crash tragedy is documented on the <u>Charney History web site</u>, along with information covering World Wars I and II.

A Mk1 Avro Lancaster bomber crashed 200 yards south of Lyford church on 8th April 1945. The aircraft, HK788 of No. 9 Squadron RAF based at Bardney in Lincolnshire, had taken part in a raid on a benzole factory in Molbis, Germany. On its return flight the plane caught fire and crashed. [At Charney Church the] Large window in south wall [was] badly damaged and several panes of glass broken in other windows by the explosion [extract only].
