Charney Mill Your Mill Needs YOU!

The Parish Council has a long lease on this building.

We have been fortunate to have had the building restored to full working order (but for the absence of a steady water supply!) thanks to tireless work by the Vale of White Horse Industrial Archaeological Group. If you haven't seen the inside of the building just ask for access.



Although restoration work is no longer taking place, we are still responsible for the building's upkeep. Volunteers are badly needed to join the one or two who have been trying to keep on top of the task. Might you be prepared to help with basic maintenance, even tidying up, for a few hours once every two months? If we can't support this work and look after the building, we are at risk of being required to hand the building back to the County Council.

Please consider whether you could spare those 2/3 hours and help look after a building which is a classic of piece and heritage gives prestige to the village. Steve Champion is the 'champion' for the building and badly needs some supporting hands. If you know him, talk to him or get in touch via the Parish Clerk. Don't just think about it, act and become part of a valued operations team (before it's too late).

Free electric blanket tests coming to Oxfordshire this autumn

Residents are being encouraged to take up the offer of a free electric blanket check, part of Oxfordshire County Council's programme to ensure everyone is safe, as well as warm, this winter.

The electric blanket tests are normally very popular, with places limited. Therefore, they must be pre-booked by phoning 01865 895999 or emailing duty.officer@oxfordshire.gov.uk
