


Charney History Group Charney from the air 1944


In August of this year a <u>collection of photographs taken during World War Two were opened to the public for</u> <u>the first time</u>. The <u>aerial images are available via Historic England</u> and were taken by the US Army Air Forces (USAAF) Photographic Reconnaissance units while stationed at bases across England in 1943 and 1944.



MVAS Date Monitoring - Period 26Th June 2023 – 25th August 2023




Outgoing vehicles Denchworth Road - Southbound






Incoming vehicles Buckland Rd/Main St –Junction - Northbound


